

## Programs offered

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Skaters are given the opportunity to sign up with the Brookings Parks and Recreation Department (BPRD) to take skating lessons. Each week skaters have a 30 minute lesson with a 30 minute optional practice time before or after each class. Classes are designed for the beginning skater to learn the basics and more experienced skaters to achieve greater proficiency.

Classes are divided by ability; test levels are achieved in sequential order. Skaters are encouraged to progress at their own pace and may move up levels at any time during the session when skills in each level are mastered.
